Attend school


Be on time and prepared for learning

Our school target for attendance is <u>97% attendance in</u> <u>a year.</u> This is proven to lead to higher grades and increased earning potential in later life.





- They will be in a House for competitive activities.











We strongly recommend that if you are unsure if an item you are buying does not meet our standards, mainly shoes, that you take a picture of these and email your child's Head of Year for clarification prior to buying the item.

FAQs – Can I change my form?

Creating tutor groups is always a difficult job, trying to get the correct balance in each form and then match this group of children to the most suitable tutor and House is complex. At the High School tutor groups are also dependent upon Options.

As a result, we will not be amending any of the forms prior to September and we ask that all students start Year 9 in the forms that they have been allocated and allow September as their settling in period. After this time, if there are still concerns, then a meeting with the Form Tutor and/or Head of Year will be arranged to discuss the best way forward.
