

Dear Parent,

As you may be aware the National Education Union has voted for strike action on February 1st 2023. We are very proud of our strong working relationships with all of our staff and completely understand that those staff taking strike action are in dispute with the government rather than individual schools. There are likely to be further bouts of industrial action in the coming months if there isn't a satisfactory resolution found to the issues that have been raised and we will update parents as and when we have new information to share.

In the meantime, on February 1st 2023, based on the indicated numbers of staff engaging with the action and following a detailed risk assessment, the school will be closed to all pupils on that day. We will provide, wherever possible, remote learning for pupils.

We recognise and apologise for the inconvenience that this may cause for many parents, but our responsibility is to the safety and wellbeing of pupils which, in light of the limited number of staff available, we would be unable to guarantee. Please ensure that appropriate arrangements are in place for the days of strike action as you will not be able to send your child to school.

We will keep you up-to-date with any further news. In the event that negotiations between the government and the Education unions see the strikes called off or postponed, the school will be able to open as normal. I will also repeat this process in advance of the planned strike on 1st March and write to you in good time with the arrangements for that day.

If your child is entitled to a free school meal, we will be happy to provide a packed lunch which can be collected on Tuesday before they leave – please contact reception to arrange this.
